Rear Commodore's Report

Education – Bob Fortenbaugh reminded everyone of the Medical Education program to be presented Friday at 0900 by Kathie King. First aid topics to be covered include splints, bandages, bleeding, burns, etc. Kathie King outlined the format which will include a 45-minute slide show followed by a break and then a number of first aid scenarios. Kathie also introduced a pocket guide to emergency first aid suggesting each boat should have one on board. The book has tabs by subject to allow easy reference and is available for \$12.95. Stephanie Davies is working on a possible bulk purchase to reduce the price. Members wanting to purchase the book should see Janet Witherup.

Hospitality – Ray & Patsy Wilkins and Dave & Cheryl Stevenson are hosts this evening with help from Ed & Mary Grosser and Cherylle Hird.

Maintenance –Jerry Rezab and Skip Hird have been replacing markers. The new red markers are highly reflective. Green markers will also be replaced. Completion is expected in 30 days.

Medical Support – Joel Berberich announced the annual CPR & AED training has been organized. There has been low attendance in past years. Upon completion of the course a Certificate, valid for 2 years, is issued. Program is scheduled for Thursday, November 10 at 1300 in the Community Center. The cost to FHYC members is \$35. The American Heart Association has a new manual which was published in July of 2016. The manual will be loaned out to members of the community or can be purchased.
